Likewise, it gives them the chance to collaborate with women artists from KASIBULAN or Kababaihan sa Sining at Bagong Sibol na Kamalayan, a women's art organization known for its work on empowering women and children through the arts.

Objectives

- **Creative hands, imaginative minds**
Participants are encouraged to express themselves creatively and imaginatively. Activities should give them an out-of-the-box experience in art making.
- **Art as play**
The art experience should not be dry and boring and play, which is very much the language of young people, should be part of every activity.
- **Art as discovery or rediscovery of one's cultural heritage**
Seeing the actual objects and knowing their relevance to our lives as Filipinos can help bridge our understanding of our roots and our present life.
- **Collaboration**
Our culture is a culture of integration and collaboration we do not separate our arts. We should pass on this cultural practice to our young people through collaborative art making. Let us create and collaborate.
